

- 12. And to the angel of the church in Pergamos write; These things saith he which hath the sharp sword with two edges;
- 13. I know thy works, and where thou dwellest, even where Satan's seat is: (Mt 24:15) and thou holdest fast my name, and hast not denied my faith, even in those days wherein Antipas was my faithful martyr, who was slain among you, where Satan dwelleth. (Lk 6:22-23/Jn 16:1-4)
- 14. But I have a few things against thee, because thou hast there them that hold the doctrine of Balaam,(Nu 22-Nu 24) who taught Balac to cast a stumblingblock before the children of Israel, to eat things sacrificed unto idols, and to commit fornication. (Jude 1:11-13/2Pe 2:15-22/Nu 25:1-9)
- 15. So hast thou also them that hold the doctrine of the Nicolaitanes, (Jer 5:30-31) which thing I hate. (Ac 20:29-31)
- 16. Repent; or else I will come unto thee quickly, and will fight against them with the sword of my mouth.
- 17. He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches; (Lk 10:38-42) To him that overcometh (Rev 17:14) will I give to eat of the hidden manna, (Jn 6:31-40/Jn 4:32-38/Rev 10:9-11) and will give him a white stone, and in the stone a new name written, which no man knoweth saving he that receiveth it. (Zec 3:8-10)

The Church in Pergamum is where the throne of Satan was. As Jesus revealed the signs of the end of the world, he told the readers to understand when you see standing in the holy place 'the abomination that causes desolation' (Mt 24:15). Pergamum is a place in which Satan who leads the whole world astray (Rev 12:9) deceives in the name of God and take control of the people of God with clever pretense of spreading God's words like Balaam.

Though they definitely refer to the Bible even today and fluently preach God's words to show that they follow them wholeheartedly, the secularized church leaders (Mt 23:16-18) whose actions are directed by a desire for materials and authority are said to the Nicolaitans following the teachings of Balaam (Jude 1:11-13).

Current Status: They call themselves arbitrators between God and his people but allow the Nicolaitans who are following the teachings of Balaam who turn believers into blinded followers with a strong desire for materials and authority.

The Reference Verses of the Church in Pergamum

(Mt 24:15)

15. When ye therefore shall see the abomination of desolation, spoken of by Danielthe prophet, stand in the holy place, let him understand

(Lk 6:22-23)

- Blessed are ye, when men shall hate you, and when they shall separate you from their
- 22. company, and shall reproach [you], and cast out your name as evil, for the Son of man's sake.
- 23. Rejoice ye in that day, and leap for joy: for, behold, your reward is great in heaven: for in the like manner did their fathers unto the prophets.

(Jn 16:1-4)

- 1. These things have I spoken unto you, that ye should not be offended.
- 2. They shall put you out of the synagogues: yea, the time cometh, that whosoever killeth you will think that he doeth God service.
- 3. And these things will they do unto you, because they have not known the Father, nor me.
- 4. But these things have I told you, that when the time shall come, ye may remember that I told you of them. And these things I said not unto you at the beginning, because I was with you.

<Number 22-Number 24>

(Nu 22)

- 1. And the children of Israel set forward, and pitched in the plains of Moab on this side Jordan by Jericho.
- 2. And Balak the son of Zippor saw all that Israel had done to the Amorites.
- 3. And Moab was sore afraid of the people, because they were many: and Moab was distressed because of the children of Israel.
 - And Moab said unto the elders of Midian, Now shall this company lick up all [that are]
- 4. round about us, as the ox licketh up the grass of the field. And Balak the son of Zippor was king of the Moabites at that time.
 - He sent messengers therefore unto Balaam the son of Beor to Pethor, which is by the river
- 5. of the land of the children of his people, to call him, saying, Behold, there is a people come out from Egypt: behold, they cover the face of the earth, and they abide over against me:

- Come now therefore, I pray thee, curse me this people; for they [are] too mighty for me:
- 6. peradventure I shall prevail, that we may smite them, and that I may drive them out of the land: for I wot that he whom thou blessest is blessed, and he whom thou cursest is cursed.
- 7. And the elders of Moab and the elders of Midian departed with the rewards of divination in their hand; and they came unto Balaam, and spake unto him the words of Balak.
- 8. And he said unto them, Lodge here this night, and I will bring you word again, as the LORD shall speak unto me: and the princes of Moab abode with Balaam.
- 9. And God came unto Balaam, and said, What men are these with thee?
- 10. And Balaam said unto God, Balak the son of Zippor, king of Moab, hath sent unto me, saying,
- Behold, there is a people come out of Egypt, which covereth the face of the earth: come now, curse me them; peradventure I shall be able to overcome them, and drive them out.
- 12. And God said unto Balaam, Thou shalt not go with them; thou shalt not curse the people:
- 13. And Balaam rose up in the morning, and said unto the princes of Balak, Get you into your land: for the LORD refuseth to give me leave to go with you.
- 14. And the princes of Moab rose up, and they went unto Balak, and said, Balaam refuseth to come with us.
- 15. And Balak sent yet again princes, more, and more honourable than they.
- 16. And they came to Balaam, and said to him, Thus saith Balak the son of Zippor, Let nothing, I pray thee, hinder thee from coming unto me:
- 17. For I will promote thee unto very great honour, and I will do whatsoever thou sayest unto me: come therefore, I pray thee, curse me this people.
 - And Balaam answered and said unto the servants of Balak, If Balak would give me his
- 18. house full of silver and gold, I cannot go beyond the word of the LORD my God, to do less or more.
- 19. Now therefore, I pray you, tarry ye also here this night, that I may know what the LORD will say unto me more.
- 20. And God came unto Balaam at night, and said unto him, If the men come to call thee, rise up, and go with them; but yet the word which I shall say unto thee, that shalt thou do.
- 21. And Balaam rose up in the morning, and saddled his ass, and went with the princes of Moab.
 - And God's anger was kindled because he went: and the angel of the LORD stood in the way
- 22. for an adversary against him. Now he was riding upon his ass, and his two servants were with him.
 - And the ass saw the angel of the LORD standing in the way, and his sword drawn in his
- 23. hand: and the ass turned aside out of the way, and went into the field: and Balaam smote the ass, to turn her into the way.
- 24. But the angel of the LORD stood in a path of the vineyards, a wall [being] on this side, and a wall on that side.
- 25. And when the ass saw the angel of the LORD, she thrust herself unto the wall, and crushed Balaam's foot against the wall: and he smote her again.

- 26. And the angel of the LORD went further, and stood in a narrow place, where [was] no way to turn either to the right hand or to the left.
- 27. And when the ass saw the angel of the LORD, she fell down under Balaam: and Balaam's anger was kindled, and he smote the ass with a staff.
- 28. And the LORD opened the mouth of the ass, and she said unto Balaam, What have I done unto thee, that thou hast smitten me these three times?
- 29. And Balaam said unto the ass, Because thou hast mocked me: I would there were a sword in mine hand, for now would I kill thee.
- 30. And the ass said unto Balaam, Am not I thine ass, upon which thou hast ridden ever since I was thine unto this day? was I ever wont to do so unto thee? And he said, Nay.
 - Then the LORD opened the eyes of Balaam, and he saw the angel of the LORD standing in
- 31. the way, and his sword drawn in his hand: and he bowed down his head, and fell flat on his face.
- 32. And the angel of the LORD said unto him, Wherefore hast thou smitten thine ass these three times? behold, I went out to withstand thee, because thy way is perverse before me:
- 33. And the ass saw me, and turned from me these three times: unless she had turned from me, surely now also I had slain thee, and saved her alive.
- And Balaam said unto the angel of the LORD, I have sinned; for I knew not that thou stoodest in the way against me: now therefore, if it displease thee, I will get me back again.
- 35. And the angel of the LORD said unto Balaam, Go with the men: but only the word that I shall speak unto thee, that thou shalt speak. So Balaam went with the princes of Balak.
- 36. And when Balak heard that Balaam was come, he went out to meet him unto a city of Moab, which [is] in the border of Arnon, which [is] in the utmost coast.
- 37. And Balak said unto Balaam, Did I not earnestly send unto thee to call thee? wherefore camest thou not unto me? am I not able indeed to promote thee to honou
- 39. And Balaam went with Balak, and they came unto Kirjathhuzoth.
- 40. And Balak offered oxen and sheep, and sent to Balaam, and to the princes that were with him.
- And it came to pass on the morrow, that Balak took Balaam, and brought him up into the high places of Baal, that thence he might see the utmost [part] of the people.

(Nu 23)

- 1. And Balaam said unto Balak, Build me here seven altars, and prepare me here seven oxen and seven rams.
- 2. And Balak did as Balaam had spoken; and Balak and Balaam offered on [every] altar a bullock and a ram.
 - And Balaam said unto Balak, Stand by thy burnt offering, and I will go: peradventure the
- 3. LORD will come to meet me: and whatsoever he sheweth me I will tell thee. And he went to an high place.
- 4. And God met Balaam: and he said unto him, I have prepared seven altars, and I have offered upon every altar a bullock and a ram.

- 5. And the LORD put a word in Balaam's mouth, and said, Return unto Balak, and thus thou shalt speak.
- 6. And he returned unto him, and, lo, he stood by his burnt sacrifice, he, and all the princes of Moab.
- 7. And he took up his parable, and said, Balak the king of Moab hath brought me from Aram, out of the mountains of the east, saying, Come, curse me Jacob, and come, defy Israel.
- 8. How shall I curse, whom God hath not cursed? or how shall I defy, whom the LORD hath not defied?
- 9. For from the top of the rocks I see him, and from the hills I behold him: lo, the people shall dwell alone, and shall not be reckoned among the nations.
- 10. Who can count the dust of Jacob, and the number of the fourth [part] of Israel? Let me die the death of the righteous, and let my last end be like his!
- 11. And Balak said unto Balaam, What hast thou done unto me? I took thee to curse mine enemies, and, behold, thou hast blessed them altogether.
- 12. And he answered and said, Must I not take heed to speak that which the LORD hath put in my mouth?
- And Balak said unto him, Come, I pray thee, with me unto another place, from whence thou
- 13. mayest see them: thou shalt see but the utmost part of them, and shalt not see them all: and curse me them from thence.
- 14. And he brought him into the field of Zophim, to the top of Pisgah, and built seven altars, and offered a bullock and a ram on every altar.
- 15. And he said unto Balak, Stand here by thy burnt offering, while I meet the LORD yonder.
- 16. And the LORD met Balaam, and put a word in his mouth, and said, Go again unto Balak, and say thus.
- 17. And when he came to him, behold, he stood by his burnt offering, and the princes of Moab with him. And Balak said unto him, What hath the LORD spoken?
- 18. And he took up his parable, and said, Rise up, Balak, and hear; hearken unto me, thou son of Zippor:
- 19. God is not a man, that he should lie; neither the son of man, that he should repent: hath he said, and shall he not do it? or hath he spoken, and shall he not make it good?
- 20. Behold, I have received commandment to bless: and he hath blessed; and I cannot reverse it.
- 21. He hath not beheld iniquity in Jacob, neither hath he seen perverseness in Israel: the LORD his God is with him, and the shout of a king is among them.
- 22. God brought them out of Egypt; he hath as it were the strength of an unicorn.
- 23. Surely there is no enchantment against Jacob, neither is there any divination against Israel: according to this time it shall be said of Jacob and of Israel, What hath God wrought!
- 24. Behold, the people shall rise up as a great lion, and lift up himself as a young lion: he shall not lie down until he eat of the prey, and drink the blood of the slain.
- 25. And Balak said unto Balaam, Neither curse them at all, nor bless them at all.
- 26. But Balaam answered and said unto Balak, Told not I thee, saying, All that the LORD speaketh, that I must do?

- 27. And Balak said unto Balaam, Come, I pray thee, I will bring thee unto another place; peradventure it will please God that thou mayest curse me them from thence.
- 28. And Balak brought Balaam unto the top of Peor, that looketh toward Jeshimon.
- 29. And Balaam said unto Balak, Build me here seven altars, and prepare me here seven bullocks and seven rams.
- 30. And Balak did as Balaam had said, and offered a bullock and a ram on every altar. (Nu 24)
- 1. And when Balaam saw that it pleased the LORD to bless Israel, he went not, as at other times, to seek for enchantments, but he set his face toward the wilderness.
- 2. And Balaam lifted up his eyes, and he saw Israel abiding in his tents according to their tribes; and the spirit of God came upon him.
- 3. And he took up his parable, and said, Balaam the son of Beor hath said, and the man whose eyes are open hath said:
- 4. He hath said, which heard the words of God, which saw the vision of the Almighty, falling into a trance, but having his eyes open:
- 5. How goodly are thy tents, O Jacob, and thy tabernacles, O Israel!
- 6. As the valleys are they spread forth, as gardens by the river's side, as the trees of lign aloes which the LORD hath planted, and as cedar trees beside the waters.
- 7. He shall pour the water out of his buckets, and his seed shall be in many waters, and his king shall be higher than Agag, and his kingdom shall be exalted.
 - God brought him forth out of Egypt; he hath as it were the strength of an unicorn: he shall
- 8. eat up the nations his enemies, and shall break their bones, and pierce them through with his arrows.
- 9. He couched, he lay down as a lion, and as a great lion: who shall stir him up? Blessed is he that blesseth thee, and cursed is he that curseth thee.
 - And Balak's anger was kindled against Balaam, and he smote his hands together: and Balak
- 10. said unto Balaam, I called thee to curse mine enemies, and, behold, thou hast altogether blessed them these three times.
- 11. Therefore now flee thou to thy place: I thought to promote thee unto great honour; but, lo, the LORD hath kept thee back from honour.
- 12. And Balaam said unto Balak, Spake I not also to thy messengers which thou sentest unto me, saying,
 - If Balak would give me his house full of silver and gold, I cannot go beyond the
- 13. commandment of the LORD, to do either good or bad of mine own mind; but what the LORD saith, that will I speak?
- 14. And now, behold, I go unto my people: come therefore, and I will advertise thee what this people shall do to thy people in the latter days.
- 15. And he took up his parable, and said, Balaam the son of Beor hath said, and the man whose eyes are open hath said:
- 16. He hath said, which heard the words of God, and knew the knowledge of the most High, which saw the vision of the Almighty, falling into a trance, but having his eyes open:

- I shall see him, but not now: I shall behold him, but not nigh: there shall come a Star out of
- 17. Jacob, and a Sceptre shall rise out of Israel, and shall smite the corners of Moab, and destroy all the children of Sheth.
- 18. And Edom shall be a possession, Seir also shall be a possession for his enemies; and Israel shall do valiantly.
- 19. Out of Jacob shall come he that shall have dominion, and shall destroy him that remaineth of the city.
- 20. And when he looked on Amalek, he took up his parable, and said, Amalek was the first of the nations; but his latter end[shall be that he perish for ever.
- 21. And he looked on the Kenites, and took up his parable, and said, Strong is thy dwellingplace, and thou puttest thy nest in a rock.
- 22. Nevertheless the Kenite shall be wasted, until Asshur shall carry thee away captive.
- 23. And he took up his parable, and said, Alas, who shall live when God doeth this!
- 24. And ships shall come from the coast of Chittim, and shall afflict Asshur, and shall afflict Eber, and he also shall perish for ever.
- 25. And Balaam rose up, and went and returned to his place: and Balak also went his way.

(Jude 1:11-13)

- Woe unto them! for they have gone in the way of Cain, and ran greedily after the error of Balaam for reward, and perished in the gainsaying of Core.
 - These are spots in your feasts of charity, when they feast with you, feeding themselves
- 12. without fear: clouds[they are without water, carried about of winds; trees whose fruit withereth, without fruit, twice dead, plucked up by the roots;
- 13. Raging waves of the sea, foaming out their own shame; wandering stars, to whom is reserved the blackness of darkness for ever.

(2Pet 2:15-22)

- 15. Which have forsaken the right way, and are gone astray, following the way of Balaam the son of Bosor, who loved the wages of unrighteousness;
- 16. But was rebuked for his iniquity: the dumb ass speaking with man's voice forbad the madness of the prophet.
- 17. These are wells without water, clouds that are carried with a tempest; to whom the mist of darkness is reserved for ever.
- 18. For when they speak great swelling words of vanity, they allure through the lusts of the flesh, through much wantonness, those that were clean escaped from them who live in error.
- 19. While they promise them liberty, they themselves are the servants of corruption: for of whom a man is overcome, of the same is he brought in bondage.
 - For if after they have escaped the pollutions of the world through the knowledge of the Lord
- 20. and Saviour Jesus Christ, they are again entangled therein, and overcome, the latter end is worse with them than the beginning.
- 21. For it had been better for them not to have known the way of righteousness, than, after they have known it, to turn from the holy commandment delivered unto them.

22. But it is happened unto them according to the true proverb, The dog is turned to his own vomit again; and the sow that was washed to her wallowing in the mire.

(Nu 25:1-9)

- 1. And Israel abode in Shittim, and the people began to commit whoredom with the daughters of Moab.
- 2. And they called the people unto the sacrifices of their gods: and the people did eat, and bowed down to their gods.
- 3. And Israel joined himself unto Baalpeor: and the anger of the LORD was kindled against Israel.
 - And the LORD said unto Moses, Take all the heads of the people, and hang them up before
- 4. the LORD against the sun, that the fierce anger of the LORD may be turned away from Israel.
- 5. And Moses said unto the judges of Israel, Slay ye every one his men that were joined unto Baalpeor.
 - And, behold, one of the children of Israel came and brought unto his brethren a Midianitish
- 6. woman in the sight of Moses, and in the sight of all the congregation of the children of Israel, who were weeping before the door of the tabernacle of the congregation.
- 7. And when Phinehas, the son of Eleazar, the son of Aaron the priest, saw it, he rose up from among the congregation, and took a javelin in his hand;
 - And he went after the man of Israel into the tent, and thrust both of them through, the man
- 8. of Israel, and the woman through her belly. So the plague was stayed from the children of Israel.
- 9. And those that died in the plague were twenty and four thousand.

(Jer 5:30-31)

- 30. A wonderful and horrible thing is committed in the land;
- 31. The prophets prophesy falsely, and the priests bear rule by their means; and my people love to have it so: and what will ye do in the end thereof?

(Ac 20:29-31)

- 29. For I know this, that after my departing shall grievous wolves enter in among you, not sparing the flock.
- 30. Also of your own selves shall men arise, speaking perverse things, to draw away disciples after them.
- 31. Therefore watch, and remember, that by the space of three years I ceased not to warn every one night and day with tears.

(Lk 10:38-42)

- Now it came to pass, as they went, that he entered into a certain village: and a certain woman named Martha received him into her house.
- 39. And she had a sister called Mary, which also sat at Jesus' feet, and heard his word.

- 40. But Martha was cumbered about much serving, and came to him, and said, Lord, dost thou not care that my sister hath left me to serve alone? bid her therefore that she help me.
- 41. And Jesus answered and said unto her, Martha, Martha, thou art careful and troubled about many things:
- 42. But one thing is needful: and Mary hath chosen that good part, which shall not be taken away from her.

(Rev 17:14)

14. These shall make war with the Lamb, and the Lamb shall overcome them: for he is Lord of lords, and King of kings: and they that are with him are called, and chosen, and faithful.

(Jn 6:31-40)

- 31. Our fathers did eat manna in the desert; as it is written, He gave them bread from heaven to eat.
- 32. Then Jesus said unto them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Moses gave you not that bread from heaven; but my Father giveth you the true bread from heaven.
- 33. For the bread of God is he which cometh down from heaven, and giveth life unto the world.
- 34. Then said they unto him, Lord, evermore give us this bread.
- 35. And Jesus said unto them, I am the bread of life: he that cometh to me shall never hunger; and he that believeth on me shall never thirst.
- 36. But I said unto you, That ye also have seen me, and believe not.
- 37. All that the Father giveth me shall come to me; and him that cometh to me I will in no wise cast out.
- 38. For I came down from heaven, not to do mine own will, but the will of him that sent me.
- 39. And this is the Father's will which hath sent me, that of all which he hath given me I should lose nothing, but should raise it up again at the last day.
- 40. And this is the will of him that sent me, that every one which seeth the Son, and believeth on him, may have everlasting life: and I will raise him up at the last day.

(Jn 4:32-38)

- 32. But he said unto them, I have meat to eat that ye know not of.
- 33. Therefore said the disciples one to another, Hath any man brought him [ought] to eat?
- 34. Jesus saith unto them, My meat is to do the will of him that sent me, and to finish his work.
- 35. Say not ye, There are yet four months, and [then] cometh harvest? behold, I say unto you, Lift up your eyes, and look on the fields; for they are white already to harvest.
- 36. And he that reapeth receiveth wages, and gathereth fruit unto life eternal: that both he that soweth and he that reapeth may rejoice together.
- 37. And herein is that saying true, One soweth, and another reapeth.
- 38. I sent you to reap that whereon ye bestowed no labour: other men laboured, and ye are entered into their labours.

(Rev 10:9-11)

- And I went unto the angel, and said unto him, Give me the little book. And he said unto me,
- 9. Take it, and eat it up; and it shall make thy belly bitter, but it shall be in thy mouth sweet as honey.
- 10. And I took the little book out of the angel's hand, and ate it up; and it was in my mouth sweet as honey: and as soon as I had eaten it, my belly was bitter.
- 11. And he said unto me, Thou must prophesy again before many peoples, and nations, and tongues, and kings.

(Zec 3:8-10)

- 8. Hear now, O Joshua the high priest, thou, and thy fellows that sit before thee: for they are men wondered at: for, behold, I will bring forth my servant the BRANCH.
 - For behold the stone that I have laid before Joshua; upon one stone [shall be] seven eyes:
- 9. behold, I will engrave the graving thereof, saith the LORD of hosts, and I will remove the iniquity of that land in one day.
- 10. In that day, saith the LORD of hosts, shall ye call every man his neighbour under the vine and under the fig tree.
